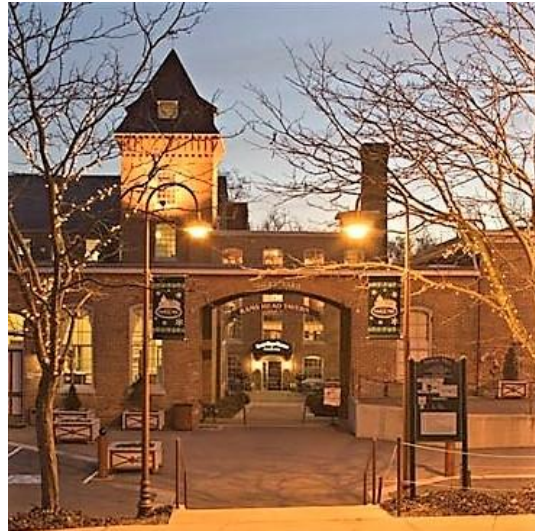

## Day Trip November 14: Historic Savage Mill, Maryland

Operating as a textile mill from 1822 until 1946, Savage Mill was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1974. Today, the historic complex is home to a collector-quality antiques center, home furnishing stores, craft galleries, artist studios, specialty shops, a destination restaurant, a French bakery, and custom chocolatier.

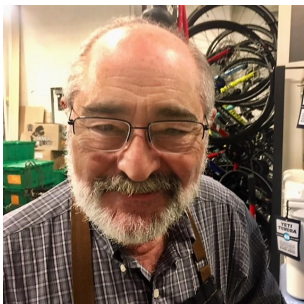

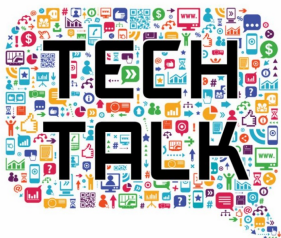

## October in Review

October's most memorable evening was when 25 Village members welcomed The Wharf in a uniquely waterfront way – from the water! The weather wasn't cooperative, but our members and the crew of "The American Spirit" made the best of a damp evening.



October also saw Waterfront Village host the regional gathering of over 50 senior village leaders at St. Augustine's Episcopal Church, a great opportunity to showcase our neighborhood and the District's newest senior village.

The Wellness Outreach Series, funded by a matching grant from Friends of Southwest DC and Friends of Waterfront Village, continued with two home-themed seminars: Home Organization and Medical House Calls. December seminars are anticipated to focusing on Later Life Planning: Medical, Legal, and Health.

The Village welcomed 7 new member households and 3 upgrades from Supporting to Full participation, the highest number of new members of any month in 2017. Waterfront Village now includes 86 member households representing 127 dues-paying individuals – closing in on our goal of 100 households by the end of this year.

A new and unique event was attending the DC Design House. Supporting Member Juanzetta Flowers summarized the day best: "The house itself was amazing, all 27,000+ square feet of it, but the designs by the various decorators were stunning. We had a very tasty lunch in the cafe. Afterward, we dropped some money at the gift shop. It was full of unique and enticing things to admire and take home with you. The entire morning was delightful."
