Meet Eva Whitaker: Longtime Southwest resident, New Village Member and Donor

According to a recent **U.S. Census Bureau report**, people in the U.S. have, on average, a 25.5 minute commute to work – most typically by car. Not so for Eva Whitaker.

In the early 1980s, Eva was living in Hyattsville, Maryland, and working for the General Services Administration at Seventh and D Streets, S.W. She decided she wanted to live closer to work so Eva found an apartment in Capital Park Plaza and, eventually, she purchased a townhouse condominium at Capitol Park IV.


