Thorny Staples says one of the most surprising things about being involved with the Village is the interesting array of older people who live here.

And he is one of them. He is a stone sculptor with a degree in systems engineering who worked as a programmer at the University of Virginia for many years so he could attempt to make a career as a sculptor.

"I was always the first in line when a humanities-related project came through the door. That led to me being the Project Director at the Institute for Advanced Technology in Humanities where, starting in 1992, we developed some of the first large-scale digital humanities projects."
