Prior to this, she has lived in several neighborhoods in the metro area including Hyattsville and Silver Spring. Maryland, and Vienna, Virginia, before moving back to Washington, D.C. for good. She says she enjoys the vibrant urban environment of D.C

Vi came to the U.S. from the Philippines to do graduate studies on a full scholarship at the Maxwell School of Syracuse University in Upstate New York. In 1967, she moved to Washington, befitting her interest in world affairs and believing it the natural place for her to begin a career.



Her career progression started in the private sector beginning as a researcher for the Brookings Institution, co-authoring a book on Bulgaria for American University and directing a project on health care for the General Electric Company. This last job brought her opportunities for travel all over the United States lecturing on the merits of her project and enabling her to present conference papers in Liverpool, England and Baghdad, Iraq in the late 1970's.
