

Volunteer Profile: Frani Williams



Frani Williams came to D.C. for college at Howard University and never looked back. She grew up in Mckeesport, a small town in western Pennsylvania, and moved to Southwest when she started working at Blue Cross Blue Shield, which used to have its main office in the neighborhood.

That was 31 years ago. A lot has changed in Frani's life and the neighborhood since then.

Frani married and lost her husband in the 1980's, and after that experience, she decided to go back to school to get a master's degree in counseling, which she received in 1991.

"I was young when my husband died, and I was trying to make sense of it," she said. "I felt there's a reason why this happened in my life. My take on it was, not only can I do something different, but I can grow in another way," she said.
