Donor Profile: Susan Bradshaw



Susan Bradshaw met Waterfront Village member Rita I. Coll in the late 1960's when they both worked for the U.S. Army's Special Services, which delivers recreation and social services on military installations all over the world.

Fifty years later, they're still friends!

Rita was born in the U.S. Virgin Islands (USVI) and when she retired in the 1980's she decided to divide her time between St Thomas, USVI, and her apartment in Harbour Square. In 2016, Rita decided to live full-time in Southwest.

"I suggested she consider looking into the Waterfront Village," Susan said. "We were poking around trying to find ways Rita could make new friends and find support for the activities she enjoys while living independently." 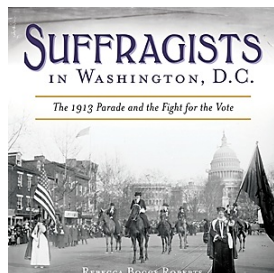

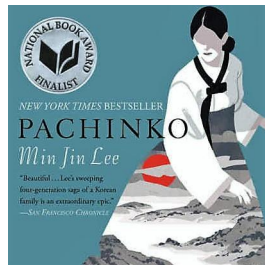
